- Facilitate Look Good Feel Better workshops for women being treated for cancer (in recess 2022)
- Donate funds for worthy causes such as essentials packs for women's refuges, a pony for Riding for Disabled, computer and printer for Parenting House, above ground herb garden for SCOSA, RSL helicopter.
- Advocacy: support for upgrading the Women's War memorial; support for victims of DV; letters to politicians
- Local Women Achievers Awards recognise contributions to the community.
- Bursary for secondary female students at 3 local schools for academic achievement and leadership.
- Support Girl Guide units in Crystal Brook and Pt Pirie

S. I. of South- East Asia Pacific Federation Projects

Every two years, clubs have the opportunity to put forward a proposal for a new Federation Project. Previous Federation Projects have resulted in:

- Birthing in the Pacific: Improving maternal health; educating midwives, community health workers and village birth attendants. Providing opportunities for up-skilling, medical equipment and training supplies.
- Hands across the Borders: Bringing health, education and economic opportunities to Sampovloun, Cambodia. Improving sanitation and infrastructure. Providing basic supplies for the School and Hospital and the up-skilling of nurses.
- Establishing the first clinic in Papua New Guinea for victims of domestic violence.
- Sanctuary Building a shelter for women and children who are victims of domestic violence in Fiji. The shelter is cyclone proof and also provides shelter to the community during cyclones.

Current Federation Project: *Brilliant Futures*

Support for educational projects for women and girls being developed by clubs in the South-East Asia Pacific Federation. Qualifying clubs are given up to \$10,000 towards the cost of the project.
